Choose from a wide variety of graduate educational programs

K-12: The College of Education offers master's, educational specialist, and certificate degrees for careers in K-12 settings as classroom teachers; school or district administrators; school psychologists, school counselors; or specialists in a particular educational area, such as literacy for special needs, special education, or curriculum and instruction. Many students who are already teachers choose our programs to enhance their skills. We also offer continuing education and professional development programs. Our Master in Teaching program (MIT) is our only full-time cohort program; all other programs in the College of Education are part time offered in the evening and weekends and designed for working adults.

Higher education and teaching adults: Prepare to serve other adults through master's and certificate programs in Adult Education and Training, Community Counseling, Student Development Administration, or Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages. Graduates of the Doctoral Program in Educational Leadership hold faculty and leadership positions at major universities, two- and four-year colleges, in school districts, corporations, and nonprofits throughout the region and the nation.
