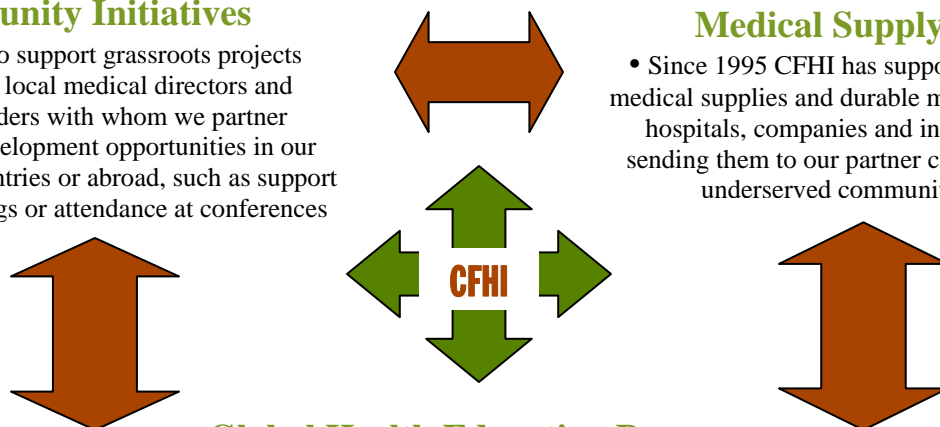


### Community Initiatives

## GLOBAL HEALTH EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Since 1992, Child Family Health International has run global health, service-learning programs for over 5,000 pre-medical, medical, nursing, MPH, PA and other students of the health sciences. Students travel to **Bolivia, Ecuador, India, Mexico, and South Africa** to immerse themselves in new cultural contexts and to learn first hand about the way healthcare is practiced and experienced worldwide. Students have come from nearly 500 of the top schools in the U.S. and the world. CFHI has also formed institutional partnerships with schools such as Stanford University and University of California, Davis.



## ALUMNI IMPACT

By developing an educational paradigm that emphasizes sustainable solutions not only at the community-based level but also through the encouragement of life-long personal involvement, CFHI motivates students to serve as agents of change and improve the lives of many thousands of people. Here are **three** stories:

- Determined to make a difference in addressing oral health problems in Bolivia, one alumnus contacted dental supply manufacturing companies in the US urging them to make donations. Oral health donations made by these companies included toothpaste, toothbrushes and expensive filling material which were sent through students participating in CFHI's Pediatric Health Program in Bolivia and distributed amongst hundreds of local children
- Jorge Gallardo is a slum with no running water or sanitation, and an infant mortality rate of 18% for children under 15 months. One alumna enlisted the support of her father (an engineer) and eight volunteer nursing students to raise \$115,000 to construct an irrigation system—and conduct health screenings—for this community
- Traveling many miles through the Ecuadorian jungle to visit sick relatives in the hospital, family members had nowhere to stay until CFHI alumni built a hut with sleeping accommodations and a kitchen for them to prepare traditional food and provide comfort care



## COMMUNITY HEALTH PROJECTS

CFHI launched our first round of Community Health Projects in 2005 to increase our support for health initiatives devised by the doctors and other community leaders who host and teach our students. Below are brief descriptions of some of the projects we are currently supporting:

- **Bolivia: Children Living in Jails** — Project integrating medical aid, psychological and social support for young children who have to accompany their parents to prison.
- **India: Health Promoter Trainings** — Trains nine women elected by their peers from neighboring villages to deal with a variety of healthcare issues, especially in the area of maternal and child health.
- **South Africa: The Avian Park Clinic Renovation** — Transforming a dilapidated building into a fully functioning clinic. After construction operations will be maintained together with the Department of Health, staff from a local university and local townspeople.
- **Ecuador: Stemming the Rise of Type 2 Diabetes** — Designing and implementing a tracking system for 130 patients with Type 2 diabetes in rural and remote areas of the Ecuadorian Amazon.



## OTHER COMMUNITY INITIATIVES

More than \$1.6 million worth of medical supplies were secured, shipped and distributed to our partners overseas in 2008; donations of cash and medical supplies have been crucial to all of these efforts. CFHI expects to send approximately \$1 million in medical supply donations to our overseas partners in 2009. CFHI also supports several professional development opportunities including TrainHealth.org which funds the training of nurses in India who do not have the resources to pay for a nursing education. Change.org (<http://www.change.org/cfhi>) is another way in which CFHI contributes to our international sites by providing a venue where community activists and those with connections to CFHI can join to fundraise and elevate awareness of CFHI clinics and community projects.
