- **Who:** Volunteers in good physical health between the ages of 18 to 70, or under 18 with parent consent.
- **When:** First & third Monday of any month, minimum stay 1 week and maximum stay 1 year.
- **Where:** Argentina, Brazil, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Guatemala, and Peru
- **What:** Volunteer with local at-need community projects in the following fields: education, social services to support children and women, orphanages/community centers, environmental & wildlife conservation, medical/health, public policy, nutrition.
- **How:** First submit your Volunteer Application, interview,

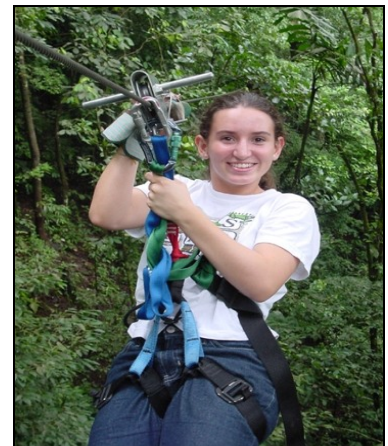

- ✓ **Arrival Pick-Up and Orientation**
All volunteers are picked up at the airport by our local coordinator who will then help them settle into the guest house or host family. The first week includes introductions and orientation to help you settle into your project.
- ✓ **International Traveler's Insurance with Basic Major Medical Coverage**
Our policy provides basic medical coverage. Additional policies and premium plans are available at extra cost.
- ✓ ***Cultural Embrace* "Culture Kit"**
Before your departure, we will send you a cultural kit that is filled with useful tips, advice, in-

formation, and your insurance card to prepare you for your amazing adventure of living and working abroad.

✓ Full-time Representation

Cultural Embrace provides English-speaking representation in the United States and Latin America prior to, during, and after your placement.

Requirements:

In order to participate in this volunteer program, *Cultural Embrace* requires that you:

- Be between the ages of 18 to 70. Or, if younger than 18, you must have parental or guardian consent
- Have good physical health
- Be open to foreign cultures and living abroad
- Have a high level of responsibility
- Be dedicated to the full term of commitment
- Be a team player
- Enjoy providing a service and working with others in a challenging environment



Project Options:

Orphanage Assistance/Street Children

Work in local orphanage homes or shelter for abandoned children. All of these children have come from poor families and suffer from malnutrition and neglect. Assist the limited staff to care for these children. Organize recreational activities, educational activities, sports, arts, crafts, and be the nurturing heart and helping hand that can encourage the children and local staff.

Teach/Tutor

Assist the local teachers at public schools and community centers with their English classes and other subjects, and provide an inspirational native tongue to the students. Or, act as a role model for struggling teenagers and adults through informal education classes. Most of these students have dropped out of school, but want to look at alternate opportunities to continue their education.

Social Welfare Development

Work in facilities that help the poor communities of an area. Provide support to at-risk and at-need women and children to learn values, manner, and life skills to become self-sufficient and obtain a higher level of education. Past projects range from tutoring, cleaning, carpentry, program develop-

ment, sewing, cooking, childcare, business skills training, administrative, data entering,

Health/Medical Clinics

Work alongside community health and medical clinics. Be a friend to patients, assist medical staff, and organize health/nutrition classes. Knowledge of nutrition, health and medical field are preferred for these projects.

Wildlife Conservation

Participate in wildlife conservation projects to help preserve natural habitats of the local area. Sample projects include sea turtle and bird conservation in Costa Rica, marine conservation in Ecuador.

Environment/Ecology Conservation

Learn and practice how to be a living example of nature conservation. Work on a private nature reserve and crop experimentation site. Duties include restoring and improving the grounds, plantations and facilities.

Building/Construction Maintenance

Lend an extra hand with a variety of laborious jobs. Assistance for building, painting, gardening, and wiring are needed for a variety of projects.

How to Apply:

- Copy of your passport (information page only)
- Cover Letter in English explaining why you want to Volunteer in Latin America
- Two References: preferably professional and/or character references
- Doctor's note verifying that you are in excellent mental and physical health
- Copy of Police Clearance (obtainable from your community's local police station)
- Two 1½" x 2" official passport-size photos, with your name printed on each photo
- One smiling full-length photo of yourself (for local coordinator to identify you)
- US\$250 non-refundable deposit (credited towards your program fee)



Upon receipt of your application, a *Cultural Embrace* coordinator will contact you for a 20-30 minute phone interview. Once we accept you in to our program, you will receive an invoice for the remainder of your program fee. In order for us to contact our local partners to start your placement process, we require at least 50% of your program costs. We recommend submitting your application and program fee at least 3-4 months prior to your desired start date in order for us to organize and arrange your volunteer placement.

**Cultural Embrace* requires an expedited application fee for those applying 16 weeks or less before the desired date of departure. Applications received 12-16 weeks prior to desired departure date will be charged \$150. Applications received fewer than 12 weeks before the desired departure date will be charged \$250.

Frequently Asked Questions:

1) *Why should I pay to volunteer abroad, and where does my money go to with **Cultural Embrace**?*

Cultural Embrace and our local partners in Latin America specialize in arranging a guaranteed volunteer placement, housing and insurance prior to your departure. This will alleviate the troubles and stress of getting everything organized in a new country, so you will have more time and energy to spend on your volunteer project and living abroad. Your time abroad will still be an independent and memorable one, but we are here to guide you to a safe, healthy and comfortable experience before, during, and after your adventure.

You will be assigned an experienced Program Coordinator from our Austin, Texas office. He/She will provide personalized attention to help pre-arrange your volunteer placement, housing and travel needs. Our Program Coordinator will work with our in-country representative to match your requests and background skills with the availability and needs of the local employer. Once you go abroad, you will be assisted by our in-country representative, and will typically have a direct supervisor for your project, as well.

Your program fee includes your customized volunteer place-

ment, housing and meals, airport transfer, orientation, basic international traveler's insurance, and all of the administrative and logistical costs to set up your placement in the States and Latin America. **Cultural Embrace** also pro-rates the expenses for marketing, advertising, and site visits/communication among all of our programs within our fees.

2) *What are the living conditions like?*

While on your volunteer placement, you will either stay in a pre-screened and carefully selected host family; or a clean, simple volunteer lodge. If staying with a host family, you will typically have a private room with shared bathroom and common area. All rooms in volunteer lodges are shared with 2-4 people per room and common areas like a hostel. Social activities are planned so volunteers will get to know each other and enjoy working on projects together.

3) *What type of meals are included?*

Typical meals are enjoyed by all, especially for those who have a knack for flavorful dishes, beans, and rice. Vegetarian and dietary meals may be met, however, if you have specific allergies, you may need to provide your own food. Please list any special dietary requirement on your application.

4) *What is the application process like, and when will I have confirmation about my volunteer project?*

After C.E. receives your completed application, you will be assigned a personal Program Coordinator who will work with you through your departure and beyond. He/She will conduct ~30 phone/web interview (or in person, if applicable) to discuss your background, goals, and expectations of a volunteer placement. Then, you will receive an invoice for the remainder of the program, and once we receive at least half of this fee, we will send your details to Latin America to find available projects that match your interests. Some companies may want to conduct a phone interview with you, which your Program Coordinator will prepare you accordingly. Placements are confirmed prior to departure with both volunteers and project managers agreeing on the terms, duties, responsibilities, and schedule.



5) *How long can I volunteer in Latin America?*

The minimum duration is one or two weeks (depending on destination), and you may stay up to one year.

6) *What type of visa assistance does **Cultural Embrace** provide?*

Participants going to Latin America for three months or less will travel on a tourist visa good for up to 90 days. If you are planning to stay longer than 3 months, you will have to apply for an extension of your tourist visa. Please note that any visa fees are the responsibility of the applicant. And, while we try to assist you during the process, ultimately it is your responsibility to ensure that you have obtained the appropriate visa for your volunteer experience. **Cultural Embrace** has

no control over the visa process and cannot guarantee that your visa application will be accepted.

7) *What should I wear and bring to Latin America?*

Depending on the time of year and location of your placement, you will need to dress accordingly. Please note that Latin America is a conservative country and the locations in which you will be volunteering will probably be more traditional than the larger cities. **Cultural Embrace** will provide you with more details in your **Cultural Embrace** pre-departure kit.

8) *Can I volunteer and/or live with a friend or partner?*

Yes, you can enroll in this program with a friend or partner. Please just let us know so we can make sure your trip is coordinated simultaneously. We encourage you to travel and explore your world with others. This enhances your experience and memories, and you can be rewarded for referring others to travel on a CE program.



9) *How long will it take to make my placement?*

We ask applicants to apply at least 3-4 months in advanced of your desired start date. The placement may take less time than this, but we want to ensure that we have enough time to find a great placement for you! There are additional administrative fees if you apply less than 3 months in advanced, and we do not contact our local partners until we receive at least 50% of the program fee payment.

10) *When should I buy my plane ticket and does **Cultural Embrace** provide any resources to help with plane tickets?*

Plane tickets should not be purchased until after your placement has been confirmed. **Cultural Embrace** works with consolidators and discount travel agencies that can help find cheaper tickets than those that are available to the general public. We have a partnership with STA Travel (1-877-236-1048) for great student/youth rates, and they have a very nominal service fee if you need to make any changes before or during your travels.

11) *What do I do if I have a problem or complaint within my volunteer placement?*

You should first speak with your project supervisor or manager to give them an opportunity to explain or investigate the situation. If the complaint still exists, then please contact your local representative in Latin America, as well as let **Cultural Embrace** (Austin office) know so we may diplomatically mediate on your behalf. Please note that you will be assigned an in-country representative that will assist you with any questions or concerns. We also encourage you to fill out our program evaluations.
