## SUMMER CERTIFICATES

Each certificate requires a series of four Summer Courses. Students can earn a certificate in as few as two summers by working at a rigorous pace or over an extended period of time.

## SUMMER LANGUAGE INSTITUTE

Experience SAIS's unique language program, which emphasizes political, economic and international topics. Students may enroll in an intensive evening course in **Arabic, Hindi-Urdu, Japanese, Mandarin Chinese** or **Political Russian** at the beginning, intermediate or advanced level.
