WELCOME TO OUR EXCITING WORLD!

Once you decide to venture abroad, a whole new world of experience opens up for you. Stepping onto foreign soil, the smells and sounds are different ... and so are the people, the weather, the language, the environment. Food looks and tastes different. And the best part of it is that you get to know your host country intimately by living and working with the people. It's a wonderful, eye-opening experience that you'll never forget. But initially this can also be a little scary and that's why we meet you at the airport and take you under our wing. **Our local Country Manager is there to help make your stay comfortable and enjoyable.** We introduce you to your new home and its customs, and to other Travellers volunteers who live with or near you.

We have **excellent local support and back-up teams in all of our destination countries.** They assist you with advice, administration or concerns and are contactable 24 hours a day. They look after you during your stay and liaise with our partner organizations to ensure that your project provides maximum benefit to both you and them.

Many of our home-based team are ex-Travellers volunteers who wanted to help other volunteers have the same enjoyable and worthwhile experiences they had. This ensures that the person coordinating your project will be able to give you all the advice and assistance you need before, during and after your trip. They fully understand how you're feeling as you approach your departure date - the thrill, the excitement, and the nerves. They've done it themselves ... and loved it!

TEACHING: English, Drama, IT, Math, Music, Languages ... the list is endless.

Kenya is Africa through and through!**

We have a wide variety of exciting projects in Kenya, including Teaching, Care, Medical and Swahili language courses. Mombasa is situated on a stunning coastline and is renowned for its laid-back culture.

TEACHING: Teach English, Sports, Arts, Drama and Music to students from 2-16 years old. Children come from a mix of backgrounds, but the majority are very poor. You are likely to be in popular demand everywhere, in and out of the classroom.

ORPHANAGE CARE FOR KIDS: You'll help with the day-to-day running of an orphanage for children aged 2-18. As well as caring for the children, you'll do some informal teaching, play games and take part in arts and crafts activities.

MEDICAL WORK EXPERIENCE INTERNSHIPS: Shadow the Doctors and Nurses at a local government hospital, observing work in the wards. You'll help with daily rounds, make medical notes and update records. You must be a medical student or have working experience in this field. Medical placements are in Mombasa and Diani.

COURSES & ADD-ON'S: Courses to improve your Swahili language skills or Scuba Dive with confidence!

COMING SOON: More exciting projects in the beautiful beach resort of Diani, near Mombasa, including Teaching, Care with Children, and Work Experience Internships.

MAURITIUS

Mauritius was formed by volcanic eruptions about 8 million years ago ... and what a success nature made of it! With a tropical climate, turquoise seas, an abundance of wildlife and activities galore for the traveler, you won't have a moment to spare!

MARINE CONSERVATION WITH DOLPHINS AND WHALES:

This project is perfect for you if you have a love of the outdoors and passion for marine life. You'll work with a well established local NGO focused on safe-guarding the marine environment of Mauritius and paying particular attention to the protection of marine mammals and coral reefs. You'll play a vital role assisting with research, conservation and awareness in the area and some of the work includes field-based research on the boat (usually 2 or 3 times a week, depending on weather), data collection and analysis for ongoing projects, i.e. photographing animals, tracking their movements, recording environmental conditions and mapping habitat use.

Other elements include learning about research techniques and methodology, boat checks and maintenance, beach clean-ups, preparing educational activities for schools, and office-based data analysis, record-keeping and administration.

ACCOMMODATION: The NGO has a beautiful house just a two-minute walk to the beach, conveniently located with easy access to some small restaurants, supermarket and bus stop. The house is divided into two sections: Volunteers live on the ground floor and the Office is on the first floor. The house has a large living area and a dining/kitchen area, two toilets and a shower. There are two balconies at the front and back which are perfect for relaxing after work and watching the glorious sunsets!

This project is worthwhile and beneficial, and also lots of fun in an idyllically beautiful location!



MOZAMBIQUE

More and more people are discovering the stunning beaches, magical offshore islands and colorful markets of Mozambique.

You'll be based in **Vilanculos**, a coastal paradise rich in culture, but with a rural, rustic feel. The main attractions are their endless white sandy beaches and beautiful coral reefs. It is a haven of tranquillity and an ideal location for snorkeling and scuba diving. Divers see humpback and bottlenose dolphins, humpback whales, marine turtles and many large fish such as barracudas and marlins.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, TEACHING AND HOME-BUILDING PROJECT:

This is a varied and fascinating project where you'll experience a variety of different activities within the local community, from teaching in a rural pre-school, youth development in a local orphanage and building houses for individuals and families in critical situations.

Each day is varied and exciting. You get the chance to work with children, helping with their English, helping to build rural homes - approximately one is built every 2 months. They're simple and rustic structures, but invaluable to the community.

Orphan Care: You'll teach basic lessons about colors, numbers and letters and participate in Development Playtime - this is where the children learn new games and play with toys that help their development. You can also assist with constructive sports games, such as frisbee and soccer. Most of all, you'll give the children the one-on-one care and attention that is so critical to their development.

ACCOMMODATION: You'll live in the rural camp in rustic yet comfortable thatched A-frame bungalows, just a stone's throw from the beach. Each bungalow sleeps 6 and has its own en-suite bathroom with toilet and shower. The volunteer camp shares some facilities, including a swimming pool! Food is provided and cooked for you, simple but wholesome!

Mozambique is a true African tropical paradise ... over 1500 miles of coastline on the warm Indian Ocean, white sands dotted with coconut palms and the spectacular turquoise waters stretching as far as the eye can see...

Mozambique is as exotic as it sounds.

No qualifications needed, just a love of animals and nature. Volunteer with monkeys, rhinos, lions, elephants, leopards, birds, cheetahs, reptiles, plants, dolphins, sharks, fish and, well, pretty much any species you're interested in ... Choosing is the hardest part!

GAME RESERVE CONSERVATION:

Help monitor wildlife species in the bush on Game Reserves and collect valuable data to help preserve rare and threatened species. You'll volunteer alongside dedicated and enthusiastic experts whose sole aim is to conserve and protect. Many of our Reserves are home to the Big 5 (Elephant, Lion, Leopard, Buffalo and our favorite, the Rhino).

● **Wildlife & Game Reserve Expedition:** Be part of a team monitoring big mammals such as **Elephant, Buffalo and Rhino**, as well as endangered species such as **Wild Dog and Cheetah**. Depending on the length of your project, you'll move between different Game Reserves while participating in general Reserve management, game capture and game relocations.

We work alongside four well-known and unbelievably beautiful Game Reserves: **Thanda**, a Big 5 Reserve that is helping to reintroduce the endangered Black Rhino, **Mkhuze**, with its astonishing diversity of natural habitats, **Tembe**, famous for its African Elephants, and **Hluhluwe-Imfolozi**, the Reserve that originally saved the White Rhino from extinction.

INTERACTIVE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION:

Fantastic projects in Sanctuaries and Rehabilitation centers where your help is sorely needed with injured, orphaned or abused animals and birds. Activities will be varied and could consist of feeding baby and adult animals, mucking out, preparing food, enriching enclosures, or even constructing them! You could also collect data and guide some educational tours for children. There may be times when you are asked to look after an animal that is either very young or has been injured, and so there can be hands on opportunities. As these are such worthwhile and popular projects, early booking is advised.

● **Wildlife Sanctuary:** In this caring Sanctuary set in a small Game Reserve in the Eastern Cape you'll assist in hand-rearing, feeding and/or looking after many different wild and domestic animal species, including about 150 different species of birds. A delightful and very popular project where your work is desperately needed and infinitely satisfying ... looking down at an animal in your arms that you've helped is an unbelievable feeling!

● **Wildlife Rehabilitation:** Rescue, Rehabilitate, Release! Your work here usually involves hands-on caring and nursing of a wide range of injured or baby animals. You'll bottle-feed, clean wounds and care for it until it is recovered. Then you'll teach it to survive on its own so that it can be released back into the wild. A very worthwhile project as well as a fantastic opportunity to get close to exotic African wildlife ... and most volunteers cry when they have to leave!

MARINE CONSERVATION:

● **Dolphin and Whale Research Project:** Bottlenose and Humpback dolphins, Bryde's, Minke, Humpback and Southern Right whales, Cape Fur Seals... they're all here! You'll be based in Plettenberg Bay and will help to research population parameters and social structures of dolphins, whales and the Cape Fur Seal, as well as tracking their movements and habitat use. You'll do field study work, data input and some administration.

● **The Multi-Marine Project (Cape Town):** An excellent wide-ranging conservation research project where you'll work with whales, sharks, penguins, dolphins and seals. You'll collect data to be used in marine management, which could include photographing marine life in order to catalogue and update conservation data. Elements of tourism form part of this project as well.

● **White Shark Project:** Have you ever dreamed about getting face to face with a Great White Shark? You'll learn Shark biology, behavior, conservation, seamanship, and more. Weather permitting, you'll observe sharks from above and below the sea on cage dives.

Projects take place in the quaint yet lively town of Livingstone, a delightfully friendly place near to the breathtaking Victoria Falls.

FUN AND ADVENTURE!

This region of Zambia is an adventure sports playground! There are plenty of things you can do in your leisure time while on your project, including:

● **White Water Rafting:** If you are looking for the ultimate thrill, then a multi-day trip along the Zambezi is definitely for you! Take a route carved by the great Zambezi over 23 white water rapids, passing sheer black cliffs and striking scenery along the way. The trip passes through the Batoka Gorge, and affords the adrenaline junkie a wild rollercoaster ride and one of the most intense sensory thrills imaginable.

● **Bungee Jumping for the very brave:** The highest commercial bridge jump in the world in the most spectacular setting over the Zambezi River.

AND MORE.... You can do Riverboarding, Abseiling, Kayaking, Canoeing, Walking Safaris, Elephant-back Safaris, Flights over Victoria Falls (outstanding!), Quadbiking, Golf, Fishing and Scuba-Diving.

TEACH CHILDREN IN SCHOOLS OR ORPHANAGES:

You can teach in primary and secondary schools, or in an Orphanage, with children aged 5-18. In this disadvantaged area, the schools are small and quite basic, so any help you can give will be highly valued. You will normally assist the teachers to start with, but, depending on your ability, you may be given complete control of a particular class or group. You'll receive a lot of assistance and support from the teachers and staff at the schools to help you prepare for your lessons and settle you into your role as teacher.

COACH SPORTS:

You can coach sports after school and sometimes during school lessons too. You'll most likely also be needed to help with English lessons, which will provide you with a very well rounded experience. The facilities are poor, but **Soccer** and **volleyball** are very popular so you'll have plenty of enthusiastic students!

MEDICAL WORK EXPERIENCE INTERNSHIPS:

Gain valuable experience in a Clinic located in a fairly remote area just outside of Livingstone. A team of doctors have converted farm outbuildings into a Medical Center and Orphanage which has benefitted the community tremendously. Although the Clinic is small, it's held in high esteem by the local community. You'll assist with the daily routine at the Center. You'll need some experience, either working in this field already or be studying medicine or a related subject.

CONSERVATION:

● **Walking with Lions:** Work on the world's leading program for the release of lions back into the wild. This is an amazing 'up close and personal' experience and a rare opportunity to work with and learn about lion cubs first-hand!

● **Chimpanzee Sanctuary and Orphanage:** Be part of the day-to-day care of Chimpanzees and other animals in a Wildlife Orphanage and observe their incredible interaction and family units first-hand. The project's main focus is Chimpanzee Rehabilitation and you'll play an important role in that, as well as providing some much needed love and attention. An excellent conservation project.

ACCOMMODATION:

Your accommodation will vary depending on your project choice. You will either live in a small, lively hostel situated in Livingstone or you will be based on the project site with other volunteers.

Livingstone has a colonial feel to it and you will find a wide variety of restaurants, bars, and shops. Your accommodation is ideally situated and can offer excellent trips to places such as Lusaka.

WALKING WITH LIONS The Lion Breeding Project:

Lions in Africa are decreasing at an alarming rate because of rampant poaching, uncontrolled hunting, diseases and diminishing natural habitats. This breeding project aims to preserve the African lion by producing a quality gene pool and rebuilding the numbers of lions in the wild. There are two locations, each with their own attractions:

★ **Gweru Park:** Here there are around 50 lions that can range from 6 weeks old to fully grown. Here you'll work **hands on with the lion cubs** - feeding them, playing with them and walking with them in Game Reserve to familiarize the cubs with a natural wild environment. You'll also monitor them to note individual characteristics and displays of basic instincts, and help with medication, cleaning enclosures, boundary patrols (to stop poachers) and snare sweeps to destroy any traps.

★ **Victoria Falls,** Here the duties you'll perform are very similar and you may assist with data collection and observation, as well as helping with the conservation education program. They currently have about 6 lions, so you get to know each individual lion very well and learn their cheeky characteristics!

ACCOMMODATION: Depending on which location you choose, you'll either live on-site or close to your project. Both accommodations are in beautiful settings with a swimming pool to relax! Rooms are shared but upgrades are available on request, at a supplemental cost. Please speak to us for more details.

There's a magic about Cambodia that casts a spell over you. It's a very popular destination and an exciting place to do a voluntary placement. You'll get to know the local people in a rich, non-tourist way.

We have two wonderful teaching projects here, one located in the glorious, beach town of **Sihanoukville** and the other on the nearby beautiful island of **Koh Rong Samloem**. We also have a superb Conservation project on **Koh Rong Island**.

TEACHING: Teach English or other subjects to children ranging in age from 3 years old up to 20. The schools are very different to schools in Western countries and the children have a hunger to learn, particularly from native speakers because it helps increase their opportunities for the future. (Cambodian children have a cultural and moral obligation to help and provide financial support to their parents once they grow up.) You'll soon find that Cambodia feels like a second home because all of the children and teachers are incredibly welcoming and friendly! You can also do a placement where you combine teaching in these two beautiful yet different locations!

MARINE CONSERVATION ON KOH RONG ISLAND: Here you'll contribute to the conservation of the local marine life as well as learning how to scuba dive in the clear blue water of the Gulf of Thailand. Once you have your Advanced Scuba Diver certificate, you'll be able to be involved in the underwater conservation work. You'll be involved in:

- Diving – Reef/substrate surveys, seahorse surveys, reef cleans, benthic surveys
- Jungle surveys – focused on orchids but includes anything of interest
- Community based projects – healthcare, waste management and education ... and more.

ACCOMMODATION: Your accommodation depends on the project you choose. On the island you'll live in bungalows just off the beach, with their own (very basic) bathroom. There is also a large communal area. In Sihanoukville you'll live in an apartment in a lovely guest house located 164 feet from the beach! Your food is provided on the Island, but you'll be given a food budget in Sihanoukville.



INDIA

INDIA is alive with color, noise, sights, scenes and scents! You'll be fascinated by its vibrant culture, warmth and hospitality. The country is beautiful and magical.

Our projects are based in **Madurai**, a bustling city in **Tamil Nadu** known as the 'Temple City' because of the breathtaking Meenakshi Temple. Rows of washing hang along the banks of the Vaigai River that runs right through Madurai, making a colourful contrast to the backdrop of dramatic mountains and exotic palm trees. It is in a great location in easy reach of many tourist destinations, such as Periyar Wildlife Reserve, the hill station of Kodaikanal, gorgeous Kerala beaches and the palaces and nightlife of Bangalore.

TEACH ENGLISH or IT and combine with Music, French, Arts & Crafts...

You'll mainly teach in 'Matriculation' schools, where it is compulsory that all lessons are taught in English. You'll help the children with their studies, become involved in their curriculum and give them an insight into your culture whilst helping improve their English. Once you gain confidence and feel comfortable, you'll become involved in lesson planning and may take classes on your own. You may also help improve classroom walls by designing and creating lively paintings! Not only will you provide invaluable teaching and education to the school, your involvement with the children will bring immense self-satisfaction and achievement.

TEACH DRAMA TO SCHOOL CHILDREN:

Teaching Drama is a great way for children to practice their English in a creative way. If you have a passion for acting and a love of children, this is the project for you!

COACH SOCCER:

Make a difference by showing your skills whilst giving back to the local children! You'll help all ages, getting involved with after-school activities and sometimes inter-school competitions. No qualifications required, just a knowledge of soccer and the ability to cope in the midday heat.

HELP CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES:

An informal teaching project with children from small babies to age 19, some of whom have disabilities such as Downs Syndrome or Autism and many of whom only speak Tamil. You'll help with hand-eye coordination, arts & crafts and possibly teach English to the staff or even help to improve their communal living area. This center is in desperate need of help and staff are very grateful to any volunteers who give time to them.

WORK EXPERIENCE:

● **Dentistry:** At a state-of-the-art practice in the heart of Madurai. You'll observe surgeries and may have the opportunity to assist on the practice's well-equipped mobile unit which gives free dental care to local schools. For invaluable experience in your career and knowledge of dentistry in another country, this placement is ideal.

● **Medical:** First-hand hospital experience: observe ward rounds, patient/doctor consultations and even surgeries. You'll have a general hospital overview as well as experience in areas such as gynecology and obstetrics, pediatrics, psychiatry, urology and neurology. You don't need previous medical experience, but you must be able to use initiative, have a willingness to learn and be prepared to be patient.

CARE FOR ORPHANS:

Help at an Orphanage with underprivileged children, from new born babies up to the age of 9. Duties include washing, feeding, changing and cleaning the children and although the work is exhausting, it is extremely rewarding! There's plenty of time for interaction and play with the babies and toddlers. This is a very hands-on placement and you'll need patience, a willingness to get grubby and an understanding and love for young children.

CULTURAL COURSES: Tamil Language Lessons, Cookery, Yoga & Meditation.

SUMMER CAMP:

During the summer holidays (April to May) 'informal camps' take place at some of our schools to keep the children entertained by playing sports, teaching drama, music and arts & crafts. This is a really fun way of helping the children improve their English, their confidence and their social skills.

MALAYSIA

Malaysia is breathtaking, colorful and friendly. With its diverse cultural background, this hassle free island encompasses the very best of South East Asia!

Our projects are based in Sabah, a Malaysian state on the island of Borneo. Sabah has lush tropical rainforests and is one of the last places on earth where you can see **Orang-Utans** in their natural habitat. In the cooler mountainous region stands the majestic Mount Kinabalu; Asia's highest mountain. Sabah has many beautiful islands where you can snorkel or scuba dive to explore some of the world's finest coral reefs. Parts of Sabah are home to indigenous tribes and villages that live in traditional longhouses.

TEACHING: Teaching is in rural village schools, where you'll help children of all ages from kindergarten to secondary school. In rural areas the children get little opportunity to practice pronunciation and speech outside the classroom, so they benefit tremendously from having native English volunteers. You'll also have opportunities to get involved with extra curricular activities - you could help produce the school play, take a singing group, or lead sports lessons. This is a rewarding project that allows you to have plenty of interaction with the local community - many volunteers have been invited to traditional weddings and parties. This is sure to be a highlight of your stay!

CARE: A live-in residential care project to help children with mental, physical and emotional disabilities as well as some young adults and abused women/children. This is a challenging and rewarding project that is capable of catering to volunteers with most types of disabilities as the buildings are wheelchair friendly and accessible.

ORANG-UTAN REHABILITATION: The Orang-Utan is one of the most endangered Malaysian wildlife species. Found only in Borneo and Sumatra, the Orang-Utans' survival is constantly threatened by forest fires, tree-felling for palm oil, poaching and illegal hunting. Protection of the Orang-Utan is vital, and that's why Sepilok Rehabilitation Center has been designated as a sanctuary for these gentle, shy and charming creatures.

The Orang-Utans at Sepilok have been orphaned, abandoned or rescued from captivity. They are cared for and nursed back to health. Before being reintroduced to the forest, they must be taught to forage for food, to defend themselves and to survive in the wild. This is where you come in. You'll help with anything from bottle feeding the infant Orang-Utans to helping rangers provide food for adult Orang-Utans living in the forest. You'll also take part in observation studies within the rainforest and spend 9 days looking after Orang-Utans at the Nature Interpretation Center of the luxurious Rasa Ria hotel. You'll gain both hands-on experience and a broader understanding of conservation-based issues affecting Orang-Utan populations in Borneo. This is an unforgettable opportunity!

Group departures take place every two months; please contact us for dates. This 8 week project is **very popular** so we advise you to book very early to ensure being able to reserve a place.

WILDLIFE PARK: Lok Kawi Wildlife Park is Sabah's newest attraction. This huge forest reserve houses many of Borneo's native species, including Orang-Utans, Proboscis Monkeys, Pygmy Elephants (including two very charming babies) and a Pygmy Rhino. The Park also has Tigers, a Clouded Leopard, Gibbons, Otters, Sun Bears, Giant Tortoise, Mouse Deer, Ostrich, Civets and a fantastic Aviary complete with talking birds. As a volunteer you'll help with general zoo keeper duties, including some hands-on contact with Orang-utans and Elephants, where possible.

WORK EXPERIENCE: Diving: Diving in Malaysia's crystal clear tropical waters is heavenly. On the famous Survivor Island, you can assist with all aspects of running a Dive/Watersports Center, gaining vital experience while perfecting your own diving skills. You can also take courses like PADI open water, PADI advanced, Rescue Diver, Emergency First Aid and Dive Master qualification. This is a popular resort and a great opportunity for you to become confident underwater and log many dives.

ACCOMMODATION: Accommodation varies depending on the project you choose. If you teach, you will live with a host family for a taste of community living. At Sepilok Orang-Utan Center, you'll live in a guest house on the edge of the rainforest. For the Diving Project, you'll live in a modern longhouse close to the island's dive resort and beach, or in staff quarters near the dive center. At Lok Kawi, one of the staff houses onsite has been designated for volunteers. All meals are provided on all of these projects; you're sure to have a wonderful stay in this unforgettable country!

SRI LANKA

Sri Lanka is an island paradise! Soft beaches, lively cities, cherished temples, roaming elephants, lush paddy fields, the friendliest people and year-long sunshine!



Our projects are located in 3 areas. The first is **Ja-Ela**, a typically bustling and lively Sri Lankan town close to the capital, providing a great base to travel out from. The second is the stunning **National Park of Wasgamuwa**, located in the middle of Sri Lanka; peaceful, scenic and alive with wildlife. The third is **Kegalle**, a small town 3 hours north east of Colombo, near Kandy and the gorgeous Sri Lankan Hill Country with its abundant tea plantations.

TEACHING IN JA-ELA: In a variety of schools and with children and adults of all ages. Classes tend to be large (30 - 35) and lively, so no two days will be the same! Teaching these energetic children will be challenging and fun because there's plenty of scope to come up with your own ideas for lessons as well as following the curriculum. In many schools you'll be able to join forces with other volunteers to teach in pairs - if you're nervous, this is a great way to overcome it!

TEACHING IN WASGAMUWA: You'll be based in a rural village within the beautiful Wasgamuwa National Park. This is a chance for a 'back-to-basics' experience amongst the beautiful Sri Lankan countryside. You'll cycle to work where you'll spend your time teaching at small local schools. In this peaceful area there's a real chance to integrate with the local community.

SPORTS IN JA-ELA: Coaching help is needed at schools and sometimes with local clubs in the evenings. You can help with Soccer (fast becoming the new Cricket in Sri Lanka!), Basketball, Netball, Track & Field and, of course, Cricket too. No experience needed, just enthusiasm, and plenty of energy to cope with the heat!

CARE PROJECTS: We work with a local NGO that has numerous worthwhile Care projects in Sri Lanka. You'll be able to work with abandoned children, teenage mothers, street children or the disabled. All of these worthwhile and enjoyable projects are perfect if you have a passion to help a less fortunate community.

PINNAWALA ELEPHANT WORK EXPERIENCE INTERNSHIPS:

ORPHANAGE: Pinnawala is a sanctuary to over 70 Asian elephants. You'll help the mahouts with their daily cleaning routine and assist in supervised bathing of the elephants in the afternoon.

This is an elephant experience, not a conservation project. And what an experience! Scrubbing an elephant with a coconut husk in the river with a back drop of the sun setting over palm trees is one experience that'll stay with you forever!

ZOO PROJECT: Work as a keeper's assistant in Sri Lanka's national zoo, located in Dehiwala, Colombo. You'll help with general duties, such as cleaning, feeding and enrichment, improving the quality of the enclosures and helping give a better quality of life to the animals in captivity. You'll be provided with a manual giving you enclosure enrichment ideas that have been implemented by well-known zoos around the world.

ELEPHANT & WILDLIFE CONSERVATION:

"Save Elephants by Helping People". You'll volunteer with an organization that's been a winner of a United Nations Development Award. Alongside locals you'll help preserve Sri Lanka's wild elephant population, with the key aim being to reduce human/elephant conflict.

Set in the stunning Wasgamuwa National Park you'll conduct surveys and help with monitoring to collect data on species and habitat density. You may also have the chance to research birds, butterflies and other flora and fauna.

● **Law:** You'll be placed with a law firm situated in the beach town of Negombo where you can see first-hand what it means to practice law in Sri Lanka.

● **Medical:** You can experience all aspects of care in this hospital in Negombo, from receiving patients at reception, to assessment & diagnosis and finally to the follow-up review before discharge. Depending on experience/qualifications, you'll shadow doctors working in a variety of departments.

MEDITATION COURSES: Take time out from the hustle & bustle of day-to-day life to learn the art of meditation at this Buddhist Retreat. This is an Optional Add-on that you can combine with any other project. Courses are available for 1 or 2 weeks.

In **Ja-Ela** you share rooms in a spacious comfortable house with a large garden, balcony, living room, TV/DVD.

In **Wasgamuwa** accommodation is very basic, no luxuries, and built entirely of eco-friendly materials. You'll have a spectacular view overlooking a huge lake and occasional water buffalo!

For **Pinnawala**, you'll share a lovely house with a TV/DVD and a pleasant living environment.

All meals are provided at all accommodations.



ARGENTINA

Argentina has everything! Magnificent mountains, vast deserts, dense forests, the majestic Iguazu Falls ... and sophisticated Buenos Aires.

Live in the seductive, bustling capital of **BUENOS AIRES** and experience the rich culture of the Porteños ("people of the port city"). Meander among colonial buildings, skyscrapers, Victorian antique shops, lively tango bars and the rainbow-colored side-streets of the La Boca district. We also have projects in **MENDOZA**, an oasis-like city of tree-lined streets and plazas filled with fountains, and the town of **MALARGUE** in the foothills of the Andes mountains ... excellent wine country and a paradise for adventure and mountain sports enthusiasts!

TEACH ENGLISH: In **Schools**, children come from a mix of poor and wealthy backgrounds and often have some English. In **Children's Homes** you can teach very underprivileged children, many from abusive backgrounds who crave attention and TLC. If you have reasonable Spanish you can help care for children whose parents either have HIV, or have died from AIDS. These children need love, attention and play time as much as they need your teaching skills. In Mendoza there are two projects with a focus on health and day care in a children/s hospital where you'll help provide emotional support and general daily care. You can also help **Community Groups** of teenagers, single mothers and adults, or to young doctors who need English to enhance their career opportunities but can't afford to have lessons. You'll teach for 10-15 hours per week, across a number of institutions. Some teaching in the early evenings. During School Holidays (2 weeks in July and between December - March) teaching will be to adult groups and in homes only.

SPANISH: We have excellent Spanish courses from Beginner to Advanced level that can be combined with other projects or taken on their own. You can study one-on-one with a local teacher, or take a course at the University of Buenos Aires. University courses include cultural visits to places of interest around the city. Such courses are intensive and last for one month only, with fixed start dates. Private lessons on the other hand are incredibly flexible and can be combined with virtually any other project. They are an excellent way to learn a language while still giving yourself plenty of time to sightsee and learn about Argentina! Also available in Mendoza and Malargue.

TANGO & SALSA: Tango is a vibrant, elegant dance, encapsulating the passionate spirit of Argentina. Before your lessons begin you'll go to a Tango Show to learn about the historical importance of this Argentinean dance. You'll then have 3 private lessons per week with an experienced teacher, one group lesson and one Milonga (open tango party where everyone dances together - good practice and socializing ... and lots of fun!) Combine this with Spanish for a true cultural experience, or why not try some **SALSA** lessons as well!

PHOTOGRAPHY: Learn on location in Buenos Aires with an experienced private teacher. You'll also be given assignments and have to investigate the city by yourself to take photographs. All courses are 4 weeks with three 2-hour lessons per week, individually tailored to your level of expertise. Digital and SLR available, no Spanish needed.

POLO: On a picturesque ranch outside Buenos Aires you can learn how to play polo and work alongside Gauchos (cowboys) to exercise and care for the polo horses - a unique opportunity at this very exclusive ranch!

CARE: Two very worthwhile programs in Mendoza, at a hospital with malnourished children or at a day care center, where you'll bring your creativity to facilitate play and games sessions.

ACCOMMODATION: In **Buenos Aires** you will stay in a friendly and comfortable Hostel in an attractive neighborhood in the city center. Meeting and socializing with volunteers and locals is a popular aspect of this project. Breakfast is included and an allowance for evening meals, enabling you to sample local cuisine in nearby restaurants. You can also stay with a host family for total immersion into the local culture. **Buenos Aires** has a lively nightlife and you're nearby a wide variety of restaurants, bars and cinemas. BA is cosmopolitan, renowned for incredible shopping and architecture. In **Mendoza**, you can live in a hostel or with a host family.

Law: Available at two international law practices in Buenos Aires and one in Mendoza. Some Spanish helpful.

Marketing: Help with marketing strategies to recruit new students at an international language school.

Tourism & Adventure: Assist in arranging and guiding adventure tours, including **rafting, horse-riding, trekking, mountain climbing, or skiing**. Spanish beneficial, as is some experience in adventure sports.

Veterinary: Work in a pet shop and animal clinic and get involved in all aspects of domestic animal care. Some Spanish required.

Health & Nutrition: In a hospital trying to combat malnutrition, focused particularly on infants. Spanish needed.

There are many options for volunteering in Brazil, from schools, centers and social projects in both locations. We'll place you at a center where your skills are particularly needed. You don't just have to teach - tell us your skills and interests and we can create a project to suit you.

TEACH ENGLISH: Learning English is so important for kids in Brazil - it gives them hope for a future without prostitution or drugs, which is the grim reality in some of the communities we help. You can teach kids of any age in any environment - just ask! You can also teach **Ballet and Dance** at a ballet school for Favela children in Rio. They are keen to learn new dance skills, so if you're good at hip-hop, Irish, Egyptian or any other dancing, this is the project for you!

COACHING SPORTS: Brazilians are passionate about Sports! Work at grass roots level in local schools, after-school clubs, local teams and project centers. Facilities vary from dusty pitches to a newly-built sports hall. As well as teaching technique, skills and strategy, you also build confidence, moral and team spirit in the children. There are opportunities to coach a wide range of sports.

DAY CARE CENTERS: With young children in a variety of Centers where the days are packed full of activities such as song, dance, drawing, painting, play and games. Oh, and of course there may be nap time too!

ADVENTURE EXPERIENCES IN FLORIPA: Including rafting, surfing, tree climbing, kayaking, rock climbing, cycling, diving, rapel, sandboarding, snorkeling, yoga and trekking... with a discount for all Travellers volunteers!

COURSES:

Portuguese: Complete immersion in another culture is, without doubt, the fastest and most effective way to learn a new language. Brazilian Portuguese is a beautiful language with an expressive and passionate musicality to its rhythm. Tuition is available for all levels for any length of time.

Photography: Courses available in the extraordinarily photogenic Rio de Janeiro. All levels from beginner to expert are catered for. You can learn anything from basic photography, studio lighting, nature, still life or flash photography. Full time or part time courses available.

Capoeira: Capoeira is a martial art, a dance and an art form steeped in Afro-Brazilian culture. It is a language of self expression and an avenue to inner freedom, with an impressive discipline and a rich history. The basic moves are simple and easy to learn!

GUATEMALA

Majestic volcanoes rising out of lush green rainforest, highland villages steeped in tradition, glistening volcanic beaches and outstanding Mayan ruins stretching above the forest canopy - it's all here in this extraordinary country.

Guatemala was the center of the great Mayan civilization from around 300 to 900 AD. From the crumbling ancient ruins of this lost civilization, whose population still dominate the wildly beautiful central highlands, to the colonial architecture of the cobble-stoned villages... history oozes from every pore of Guatemala's towns and cities. Coffee, cacao, fruit and sugar cane grow in abundance amongst the lush beaches, jungle hideaways, waterfalls and wildlife. With oceans on two sides and bordered by Mexico, Belize, Honduras and El Salvador, there is a lot to explore.

Guatemala is Central America's best kept secret. Our projects attract many volunteers from around the world, so you will always be in a very social environment at home and whilst volunteering – perfect for practicing Spanish or socializing in your free time!

Antigua is gorgeous and all of our placements are based here. One of the oldest cities in Central America, Antigua has a mellow yet international feel. The town is protected by three giant guardian volcanoes, Agua, Fuego and Acatenango, providing a stunning setting that attracts thousands of visitors each year. A typical day in Antigua will be spent relaxing with a coffee and watching the world go by, followed by an evening of music, dance and laughter. Local residents are warmly referred to as panza verde (green bellies) due to the abundance of avocados trees in the region!

TEACHING ENGLISH: There's a whole range of teaching projects for you to choose from, including schools, community and care centers, and even the local hospital. Depending on the age group (from 3 - 17) and experience you're looking for, you can choose where to lend your helping hand. We highly recommend combining your teaching with a Spanish course. This is an excellent way to have a well rounded project and make the most of your time in Guatemala.

SPANISH COURSES: *¿Habla Español?* Did you know that Spanish is spoken in over 23 countries around the world? Learn or perfect this useful skill and gain confidence by practicing it in a Spanish-speaking country. Spanish can open a world of experience for you. Even basic phrases will earn you respect from the locals and deepen your experience of the culture. Our language courses take place at the prestigious Spanish Academy in Antigua. Everyone taking part is passionate about learning and you'll absorb and retain information quickly. You'll study one-on-one with an experienced Spanish teacher, giving you the ideal foundation to practice your newfound skills around town and allowing you to learn at your own speed and level. All courses provide a certificate on request.

WORK EXPERIENCE - Care, Medical and Physiotherapy: You can volunteer alongside a doctor in a Day Clinic helping to provide free health care to the public, or in the local hospital where you'll care for newborns suffering from a labio-palatine fissure or cleft palate. You could also care for children who have malnutrition or are waiting for operations. It might be that you are simply asked to bring some sunshine and pleasure to the in-patients' lives. If you're a physiotherapist and fluent in Spanish, there is an opportunity for you use your skills to help others in need. Some projects may require a degree of knowledge or experience or training, but many don't.

DAY CARE PROJECTS: If formal teaching isn't your thing, you can help out at a day center for the youngest residents of Antigua. Here you'll be involved in play, drawing, games, painting and singing!

COMMUNITY PROJECTS: If you want to help without being in a classroom environment, then community volunteering is for you. You may be involved in organizing donations, outdoor work such as repairs, arts and crafts or cleaning and cooking at local centers such as schools and orphanages. It is a great chance for a unique voluntary placement. No qualifications, Spanish or experience needed.

ACCOMMODATION:

You'll live with a welcoming family and this offers you an unrivaled opportunity to fully submerge yourself in the culture whilst still remaining independent. You can choose whether you want to be on your own or whether you prefer a home with other students. Some families have up to ten students at one time!

All the family homes are central to everything. Your meals are provided, except on Sundays when volunteers traditionally meet up for meals together in local restaurants. There are Western and traditional restaurants, all at very reasonable prices.

"Everything is great in Guatemala, I settled in straight away and I'm having a great time! My family are really nice and welcoming and the food is great. There are 3 other people living in the house and we all get on really well. I was very surprised at how friendly everyone is, especially the Guatematecos. The Amazon Rainforest, Lake Titicaca, the mysterious Inca Ruins and Machu Picchu...
As our volunteers say, Peru is simply sublime!
The Amazon Rainforest is one of the last undiscovered territories on earth and you can be a part of helping to conserve this ancient giant.



AMAZON CONSERVATION & COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT:

You'll volunteer at a Learning Center located in a private reserve of what appears to be infinite forest, stretching from Peru across Brazil and to the Atlantic Ocean. At the center you'll monitor rainforest bio-diversity with a view to providing sustainable solutions and improved rainforest conservation. Projects undertaken fall into three main areas; **Conservation, Sustainability and Education**. Duties will include scientific monitoring & surveillance, data collection and interpretation, collection of sample species and construction (building hides and observation posts).

You'll be shown exactly what needs doing, and more importantly, WHY it needs to be done! The vast array of skills you'll learn includes: First Aid & basic rainforest survival skills; Tropical ecology; Conservation & Sustainability; Natural history; Cultural diversity; Flora & Fauna monitoring and Reforestation.

ACCOMMODATION & EXTRAS:

Placed on the edge of the Amazon Rainforest, on a hill next to a river, this accommodation is idyllic! Lighting is by candlelight as there is generally no electricity on site, but they do have solar panels and a generator. Food is provided - and it's great! There are some great Optional Add-on's. We can organize a variety of Machu Picchu treks ranging from the classic 4-day trek to a 1-day train tour. City of Lima, Cusco and the Sacred Valley tours also available.

"On our first day we saw a group of Dusky Titi monkeys. On the second, we hiked to a primary forest. There we saw a Howler monkey, Woolly Monkeys, Saddleback Tamarin monkeys, as well as the fruit loops Toucan. The entire Bio-Reserve runs very well, with facilities as good as a cosy clean home." TEACHING: There are about 200 pupils aged from 5 to 14 years old at the school we work with. The children are disadvantaged and they really need volunteers so you will be greatly appreciated. You will be able to teach English and a wide range of other subjects - IT, Sports, Music, Art, Drama, anything you have a reasonable knowledge in. Please let us know if you have a special interest and we'll do our best to tailor-make your project!

CARE: You can choose from a Street Kids project, a Children's Hospital project or an Orphanage project – all based within stunning Quito and all hugely worthwhile! Provide love and support to these children who have not had the best start in life. Put a smile back onto their faces and help them learn skills to succeed.

If you don't have any Spanish, we include two weeks of Spanish lessons concurrent with your project!

ACCOMMODATION: If you'd like to immerse yourself in Ecuadorian culture and the Spanish language you could stay with a friendly host family. If you'd prefer, you could stay at our volunteer house in a touristy area of the city, or you might like to live in a cosy backpacker's hostel. You choose!

AUSTRALIA

G'day, Mate, welcome to Oz!

Australia has over 7,000 miles of unspoilt beaches and its tropical rainforests, mountain ranges and huge outback deserts are unbeatable. Skip with Kangaroos, dive the Great Barrier Reef, catch the surf on Bondi Beach, marvel at Uluru (Ayers Rock), BBQ shrimps or drink an ice cold tinny.....

Australians love life and the great outdoors. They also love the humble meat pie, the arts and music, sport, the beach and 'barbies'. Aussie English can be confusing - 'G'day', 'fair dinkum', and 'cobber'. But don't worry, you'll soon get the hang of it and be talking like an Aussie in no time!

Our programs are based in **Perth**, the real Australia away from the main tourist crowds. Perth grew on the banks of the Swan River and has brilliant blue skies and warm sunny climate. Western Australia (WA) is home to some of the best surfing waves in the world, white sandy beaches and a virtually untouched coral reef stretching for 161 miles! .

CONSERVATION:

Wildlife Rehabilitation Center, Perth: This Center is dedicated to the protection of threatened species and has a wildlife clinic to treat and care for sick, injured and orphaned wildlife. You'll help care for the animals and prepare them for release back into the wild. You may also assist with the endangered species captive breeding program to educate the community on the need to preserve and value wildlife as a resource for a healthier living planet.

Animal Wildlife Park, Bunbury: Work in a Wildlife Park just south of Perth that has over 60 varieties of Australian native animals, from Kangaroos and other Marsupials, to native birds. The Park is dedicated to conserving Australia's wildlife and ecosystems. The Park's mission is to partner the community, promoting understanding of animals and plant life of the South West and an integrated resource center promoting environmental stewardship and sustainability. an immensely worthwhile project!

For both of these wildlife projects you'll also assist with general duties, such as weighing and preparing food, feeding the animals, cleaning enclosures and the hospital, plus assisting with all other duties.

Work with Dolphins: Up close and personal - Contribute to the well-being of dolphins in one of the most beautiful parts of Australia! Your project is based at a non-profit center in Bunbury committed to dolphin research, education, conservation and tourism. The Center enables people to interact with Bottlenose dolphins in a variety of ways. There are up to 100 dolphins living in the Bay and groups of them regularly visit the shallow waters in front of the Center.

TEACHING REFUGEE CHILDREN: Teach English to refugee children from war-torn countries like Sudan, Somalia, Afghanistan and Iraq. The children arrive with no English whatsoever - a huge disadvantage when trying to start a new life. This is where you can really make a difference. You'll help them adapt to their new surroundings by teaching them English and this, in turn, will enable them to enter into mainstream schools and be much more confident of adjusting to a new life.

COACH SPORTS: We work with mainstream high schools in Perth, ideally suited to you if you're passionate about sports. You'll volunteer alongside the regular sports teacher during school hours, usually focusing on one particular sport. Sometimes sports are taught by season, but others are available all year round.

WORK EXPERIENCE INTERNSHIPS:

Architecture: Help at a firm that has won numerous awards for their high quality, innovative projects. Expand your design and management skills and develop professional confidence.

Community Radio: Help put together programs for airing and assist with production, script writing and station management.

Law: In a private practice or specializing in providing legal assistance to refugees. You must be qualified to do this placement.

Newspaper Journalism: Experience all aspects of Journalism with a privately owned suburban paper that has a weekly free distribution.

Television: With a community TV service which provides communities access to air-time, training and equipment to produce programs for broadcast. You can work in areas such as camera and sound, script writing, research, presenting, business administration and marketing. You may also join a support crew on location.

SURFING LESSONS: Think Australia - think surfing! You can take a 1, 2 or 3-day surfing course as an extra to any project. All coaches are accredited and are crazy about surfing. They'll teach you all about riding the waves. You'll be amazed how quickly you can learn to surf!

New Zealand is the adventure capital of the world!
With both Māori and European influences, New Zealand also has a unique cultural background.

New Zealand is a very friendly and open, innovative and creative, and still developing their identity. Kiwi's (as they are affectionately referred to) have a 'can-do' attitude to life!

Auckland (where our projects are based) is modern, vibrant and multi-cultural. It is home to a beautiful harbor, numerous islands, beaches, parks and volcanoes – great for exploring. There are numerous multi-ethnic food outlets, great shops and a busy night-life scene.

With its temperate climate, New Zealand is the ultimate outdoor playground. If it hasn't been done, New Zealanders will invent it! There are so many activities available to try here, from the serene to the hair raising. Try your hand at jet boating, black or white water rafting, bungee jumping, whale watching, sky diving or assailing.

TEACHING: There is a shortage of teachers in New Zealand so you'll really make a difference here. As an assistant to the teacher, you'll get involved in a variety of subjects. Some children who form most of your class are classed as the underprivileged community in Auckland. Some are Moaris and others are from Somalia, Ethiopia, Tonga and Samoa. Most of your teaching will be one-on-one or in small groups so that the children get the attention they need. Class sizes vary between 20 and 30 per class, and the children will be aged between 4 and 12. No qualifications required.

TEACHING MUSIC: If you have a musical background, your assistance will be invaluable! You'll assist the teacher with small groups and help out with the school choir. The cultural make-up of the children makes for a unique musical experience.

SPORTS: Make a difference...get involved! Coaching Sports is fun for everyone, but also extremely beneficial in building team spirit, communication and leadership skills. You can coach a variety of sports.

CARE: Care for children with Cerebral Palsy at a local school in Auckland.

PHYSIOTHERAPY: You'll assist the regular physiotherapist at a unit for children with physical disabilities such as Cerebral Palsy, Multiple Sclerosis and mobility problems. Travellers is not a charity and does not receive government funding or any other type of support. However, we make regular and substantial **DONATIONS** of money, equipment and other types of aid to underprivileged communities worldwide

Every time a volunteer does a placement with us, we contribute not only to our own projects but to other organizations in countries which also need financial support, particularly those who need the most help, so all our destinations gain directly or indirectly from your contribution. The final outcome is that people from all different cultures, particularly children, as well as wildlife have hugely benefitted because you've chosen to do a voluntary placement with us!

HERE ARE JUST A FEW DONATIONS THAT WERE POSSIBLE AS A DIRECT RESULT OF YOUR VOLUNTARY WORK:

- In **Zambia**, we sponsor 10 children's education and provide shoes, books and other aids every year, for a very poor community school. We also fund events and activities throughout the year for the children and their unpaid teachers and we provided a new roof for the school.
- Every month we provide funds for a township kitchen in **South Africa**, an orphanage and a soup kitchen in **Argentina** and a voluntary organization in **Brazil**.

- We set up and support a summer camp for poor children in **Ghana** and provide free meals every day. Every year we provide lots of sports equipment to numerous schools and centers around the world and sponsor sports tournaments and matches.
- We buy beds, mattresses, tables & chairs, clothes, food, computers, TVs, DVD players, blackboards, books, games and other educational equipment in most of our destination countries. This type of donation is continuous and on-going and makes a tremendous improvement to school and orphanage facilities.
- We donate various sums of money every year towards **improving the quality of schools and orphanages** to make them a safer and a more welcoming place for the children. In **India** we have built a play area for orphans (with the help of our volunteers) and we have improved the living area for the center for mentally challenged children.

RESPONSIBLE TRAVEL

One of the most joyful parts of your volunteering travel experience is to make a positive contribution to the local community and environment. We work closely in partnership with our host countries to ensure that we provide projects for you that will benefit the local economy and make a constructive difference. Our projects are finely selected and we work only with organizations who will genuinely benefit from your help and enthusiasm.

Travellers believes that through education, awareness and responsibility for our actions, we can minimize or even eliminate the damaging elements of tourism. We aspire to protect, improve and respect the destinations we work in.

By traveling responsibly, being sensible and offering much needed help to our projects, you'll gain an invaluable and inspiring cultural experience ... as well as lots of fun and adventure!



ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT:

- Travel light. It's easier(!) and reduces harmful emissions on transport.
- Look into carbon neutralizing your flight. Check out www.climatecare.org
- Be sensitive to the resources of the country you are in (such as water, food and electricity) as often these are in precious supply.
- Don't leave litter and leave unnecessary packaging at home.
- Use environmentally friendly toiletries and cleaning products.
- Purify your water and re-fill a bottle rather than buying and throwing away a new one every day.
- Be aware of your natural surroundings, always respect local knowledge and learn from your guide.
- Stick to existing trails to prevent erosion. It'll also help you avoid getting lost!
- Don't touch or remove local flora, fauna, shells, rocks or corals.
- Don't buy wild animal products made from skins, bone or ivory. In many countries these things are now illegal.
- If you buy something made from wood, check that it has been sourced from a sustainable forest.
- Never touch or approach wild animals.
- Don't use a flash when photographing animals, it startles and frightens them.

CULTURAL SENSITIVITY:

- Research the country before you go! Read through Travellers pre-departure information - it's been prepared especially for you!
- Observe and respect the local cultures, religions, and traditions. Often the country will be very different from your own.
- Learn a few helpful words of the local language and consider their customs such as eating, greeting and communicating.
- Stay safe! We recommend that you check the US Department of State Travel website when traveling around after your placement.
- Dress appropriately and respect the local beliefs; cover up and don't bring attention to yourself.
- Ask permission before taking photos of local people, religious statues and buildings.
- Be careful and don't flash your money around!
- Understand the value of money in the country: consider if and when you should bargain with street sellers, be aware of the negative effects of giving money away/over tipping. Learn how to respond to begging.
- Buy locally made products, support the local economy where possible.
- Embrace the country and different pace of life! Relax and be open minded.

The **BIG PRINT** and.....

- **WHO CAN TAKE PART? You can.** Our projects are OPEN TO ALL - all nationalities and anyone from 17 years-old and upwards, whether you're a **gap year** student taking a year out, studying at university, working and taking a **career break**, a **grown up gapper** or you have **retired**. We also take **Groups and Families**.
- **FLEXIBILITY:** Projects are available THROUGHOUT THE YEAR and most have no fixed start and finish dates. This means that YOU choose when you want to start and finish your project!
- **NO FORMAL QUALIFICATIONS** are required (except for one or two Conservation or Work Experience Internships).
- We can tailor your arrangements to include **TIME FOR EXPLORING** while you're there. Our experienced team will be happy to advise you on places to visit in your destination country, and help you sort out transport, etc.
- Our projects don't carry a salary, we are not an employment agency; your participation in the project is as a volunteer and does not constitute employment in any form. *Why is there is a cost to volunteer?* The cost covers your food and accommodation while on the program, meeting you at the airport, our 24/7 support and back-up both at home and overseas, and our local team looking after you during your project - all you'll need is spending money.
- We don't hold selection interviews because our volunteers come from all over the world, so it would be impractical and too costly. However, we do take up references and we will interview you over the telephone (at our expense) to make sure the project is right for you.

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW BEFORE TAKING PART IN A TRAVELLERS PROGRAM:

Sometimes some elements of your duties within a project may change - this is because of the nature of the cultures we work within and institutions that sometimes change things at very short notice! We will endeavor to keep you informed but you should also check our website and/or phone us for the latest updates.

- You'll get out of your project what you put into it - your attitude is important.
- We have excellent **24/7 support and back-up teams** in all our destination countries (see p.3) who will do their best to ensure you have a wonderful time, but neither we nor they can make trains run on time, or change irritating local bureaucracy, or stop headmasters from saying "Yes" when they mean "No", or schools from being disorganized - all of these are cultural differences and that is the reason why ...
- You must be adaptable, have infinite patience and tolerance, be able to use your own initiative to get things done, and most importantly, take along a good sense of humor!

THE HIDDEN COSTS! Some of the associated costs with planning your trip.

- **MEDICAL & HEALTH** - Everyone wants to stay healthy, especially when you are a long way from home. Make sure you seek medical advice from a professional, such as your G.P. for any vaccinations/innoculations you may need for the country or countries you've chosen.
- **INSURANCE** is mandatory. We've teamed up with **Endsleigh**, an independent specialist, to try and take some of the stress away - cover is available to UK residents at very competitive prices. For our American volunteers just talk to us for suggestions.
- **VISA & IMMIGRATION** - Visas range in price and complexity. Generally, in most cases you can expect to pay anywhere from \$24 to \$100 for a visa valid up to 3 months, but sometimes it can be much higher. Each destination country has differing requirements.
- **CRB CHECKS** - If you're working with children, and/or vulnerable adults, you'll need a CRB check. The cost is approximately \$28.
- On some projects, the cost of transport back to the airport is not included in the price of your project - please check with your project co-ordinator if you are not sure. Remember that all volunteers will get **FREE** airport pick up on their arrival!
- There may be some other costs that are specific to your particular choice of projects and your program (e.g. equipment you may be required to take with you, transport between projects if you're doing two or more, etc.).
- A few of our projects don't include food, or transport between your accommodation and the project itself. These are clearly shown in our documentation.

ERRORS AND OMISSIONS EXCEPTED:

Every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of information supplied but the nature of our projects means the work involved can change at short notice.

All prices are correct at time of printing, but, as with all other organization involved with travel, occasionally prices are subject to change due to events and circumstances beyond our control.

CANCELLING OR AMENDING YOUR PROGRAM

Postponing: If you need to postpone for personal reasons, we may be able to defer your program - please speak to us.

Amendments: It's possible to make minor amendments to your program. Changes made carry charges from about \$50 to \$150, plus any additional costs levied by third parties.

Cancellations:

The charge for cancellation will depend on how far in advance of your originally preferred departure date you have notified us in writing, and are as follows:

- Notice of 3 months or more - about \$150 administration fee.
- Notice of 2-3 months - One-third of total cost
