Sydney Semester Internship

Picture yourself working in Sydney, one of the world's most exciting and international destinations. You can earn academic credit, enhance your professional knowledge, and improve practical skills through a placement in one of the Harbour City's leading public institutions or commercial enterprises.

Placements are available in a broad range of areas including business, social sciences, humanities, and the visual, fine and graphic arts. Our staff will work with you to identify appropriate placement options before you leave for Australia. Throughout your internship, a faculty sponsor and workplace supervisor will be available to ensure that you are meeting your professional and academic objectives. London Internship Program

Arcadia's challenging London internship program combines real world experience with relevant courses, creating a context in which to reflect and synthesize your experiences about the London workplace. For three days a week, You will join in the workday routine of other Londoners and, in the process, gain valuable insights and skills that will continue to resonate long after your program is completed. Whether you want to gain financial experience in a commodities brokerage; work in an auction house or at an advertising agency, explore non-profit management or assist a British MP in the Houses of Parliament, our internships are much more than mere observation or filing paperwork.

Placements

There are a wide range of internship placements within the art world, charitable organizations, media and production companies, healthcare establishments, government offices, and large corporate enterprises. Our experienced internship coordinators expect students to participate in projects that require resourcefulness, responsibility, and a mature work ethic. During the 15-week program, your internship placement occupies 3 days a week for 12 weeks. Placements are unpaid and may continue through the academic holidays.

Academic Program

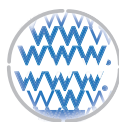

London Parliamentary Internship

For students interested in learning about the inner workings of the British Parliament and witnessing first-hand the British legislative process, the London Internship provides a unique and challenging experience. Our internships consist of much more than mere observation or filing paperwork. Students will often be working alongside a British Member of Parliament, conducting research, planning events, or assisting with logistics. The program consists of 15 weeks, with the internship placement occupying 3 days a week for 12 weeks, and awards 14-18 semester hours of credit. Your internship will be complemented with academic courses designed to expand upon your professional and academic interests while providing a cultural context for your experience in the workplace.

Academic Program

“**Working in the UK and the European Union: the Politics, Sociology and Public Policy of Business and the Professions**” is the key-stone course of the program. You'll explore issues related to British and European culture, politics, business, and society to reflect on and enrich your internship experience.

The other required course, “**Work in Thought and Action**” will require you to meet with an academic internship advisor to discuss and develop your academic project – typically a research paper, creative presentation, or portfolio -- related to your internship.

In addition, you will select 2 other courses from either Arcadia University's London Semester Program, which take advantage of London's rich resources, or you can select from the variety of courses available at City University. While our internship program is not for the timid and will require good time-management skills, the chance to work and study in London provides one of the best study abroad experiences available. London Summer Internship

Our London Summer Internship will provide you with the opportunity to become fully immersed in the professional and cultural life of Great Britain. You can expect to be in a four-day-per-week internship placement that our experienced intern coordinators will find to fit your own academic and professional objectives. Placements are unpaid and finalized upon completing an interview once you arrive in London. Students have been placed with a range of employers including arts and philanthropic organizations, media and broadcasting companies, healthcare establishments, government offices, and large corporate enterprises. The employers and organizations we work with are eager to provide students with a substantial and meaningful experience. The internship is complemented by a required course, **“Working in the UK and the European Union: the Politics, Sociology and Public Policy of Business and the Professions,”** which will provide your internship with academic context. Additionally, an academic project based on independent research and your workplace experience is required. This program awards six semester hours of credit.

Housing

Dublin Parliamentary Internship

Arcadia's affiliation with the Institute of Public Administration (IPA), the leading educational institution for civil service in the country, affords you the chance to develop a real-world perspective on Irish politics as well as learn first-hand about how a parliamentary system of government functions. Only North American students sponsored by the IPA have the privilege to intern in both houses of the Irish Parliament, the Dáil Éireann and the Seanad Éireann.

Before your fieldwork begins, you'll participate in an orientation that will prepare you for your parliamentary experience through intensive instruction that covers Ireland's Constitution, political parties, issues and procedures, and upcoming legislation. Your individual initiative, ability, past experience, and your relationship with the Member of Parliament or Teachta Dála (TD) you are interning with will largely determine the type of work you are assigned. Responsibilities may include conducting surveys, researching and reporting on issues related to public welfare, and preparing for press briefings. The internship is unpaid and requires at least two full days per week.

Courses

The courses are designed to provide you with the necessary background to work effectively in your new cultural, social and political environment, and are worth three credits each. Subjects include **Irish Society and Politics**, **History of Modern Ireland**, and **Modern Irish Literature**. Arcadia courses are taught by faculty drawn from the Institute of Public Administration and universities in and around Dublin.

Housing

There are three housing options for students participating in the Dublin Parliamentary Internship: Arcadia University fully furnished flats in Dublin, living in an Irish household, or making your own independent living arrangements.

Scottish Parliamentary Internship

If you are a hands-on learner and are a student of government, law, politics, history, economics or sociology, an internship in the Scottish parliament may be right for you. Through the University of Edinburgh's Scottish Parliamentary Internship, you can enjoy a unique opportunity to make a significant contribution by working with members of the Scottish Parliament who are sitting to enact their own laws for the first time since 1707.

Academic Program

During the first five weeks of the program, you'll participate in three courses taught by accomplished instructors from the University of Edinburgh's Faculty of Social Sciences. The courses are designed to provide students with an overview of Scottish society, history, and culture as well as focusing on Scottish government and politics and how it relates to government and politics throughout Great Britain. Students are required to enroll in the following three courses:

Government and Politics in the U.K.

Scottish Politics

Scottish Society and Culture

Following the completion of coursework, you'll participate in a 10-week internship program under the direction of a member of the Scottish Parliament (MSP). Your assigned MSP will help you determine a research project and supervise your implementation of this project, which will be assessed by the academic coordinator of the program. You will not simply act as a file clerk or go fetch endless cups of tea. You will explore and write on significant policy questions such as:

Female Representation in the Scottish Parliament, Controlling Firearms in Scotland, the Criminal Justice (Scotland) Act of 2003 and its Effects on the Criminal Courts or Suicide in Scotland: The Need for a Hotline – all topics pursued by former interns. Your assigned MSP will help you determine a research topic and supervise your implementation of this project. You will also receive research support from the University's Institute of Governance. The combination of challenging course work and the opportunity to work side by side with an MSP will provide an unparalleled academic, professional and personal experience.

Housing

You will be assigned to housing in a self-catering student flat. The flat contains single or shared rooms, and shared baths and kitchens. Access to the Internet as well as your own e-mail account is available at the University of Edinburgh's computing centers.

- Our internship program enables you to immerse yourself in the culture, history and politics of Scotland through engaging academic courses.

Semester Internship Program in Toledo

In addition to enrolling in the regular semester courses in Spanish language and culture (4 to 5 courses), the Arcadia program at the Fundación Ortega y Gasset in Toledo offers students the unique opportunity to experience the Spanish work environment and further immerse themselves in Spanish life and culture. Fieldwork is supplemented with a course that looks at the Spanish labor market from a historical, political, and economic perspective. The course challenges students to compare and contrast the Spanish workplace with that of their own country, as well to identify cross-cultural communication issues and strategies for resolving them. Students spend one and one-half hours in class each week and approximately seven hours at the internship site and earn 3 credits.

All internships are supervised by professionals in the related field. Past internship sites have included the regional parliament of Castilla La Mancha, Santa Cruz Museum, Toledo City Hall, Radio stations "Onda Cero" and "Radio Nacional de Espana" the Alcazar library, Toledo Chamber of Commerce, and local hospitals.

Housing

Housing is a key component of your experience in Toledo. Arcadia offers you the option of living in the residence hall at the Fundación or with a carefully selected Spanish host family (for an additional fee). Our coordinator can help you decide which option would match your particular situation and objectives for your time abroad.

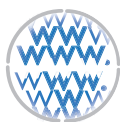
